Antonia "Toni" Marotta-Brinton, '83



An entrepreneur, philanthropist, author and community volunteer, Antonia "Toni" Marotta-Brinton will be honored tonight as the recipient of the Spirit of Edison Award for Distinguished Alumnus. Marotta-Brinton graduated from Thomas Edison State College in 1983 with an Associate of Arts degree.

Marotta-Brinton, co-founder and former co-director of Lean Line Inc., is a noted authority on weight loss and weight control. The company has been a leading proponent of sound, healthful, long-term weight loss through proper nutrition and behavior modification since it was founded in 1968.

Retired from Lean Line in 1995, Marotta-Brinton now serves on the boards of the Plainfield Health Center, United Family & Children's Society, Henry H. Kessler Foundation and United Trust Bank. She also serves as a volunteer for the YWCA and a member of the SCORE (Service Corps of Retired Executives) Board, a federally funded organization that advises people who are interested in starting their own businesses.

Marotta-Brinton was the co-creator, co-producer and on-the-air co-hostess of the "Willpower Quarter Hour" cable television program that aired daily for more than two years. She co-authored two books, *Diet Cybernetics for Lean Lines* and *One Month Lighter*. In addition, she has written numerous articles on diet and nutrition for newspapers, magazines and newsletters. Marotta-Brinton is the recipient of a special award for health from AMITA (Italian American Women of Achievement) and received awards from the Plainfield Health Center and the Morris Museum.

Widowed in 1991 after 40 years of marriage to Nicholas Marotta, former president and CEO of National Starch and Chemical Corp., she married S. Jervis Brinton, Jr., chairman of Brinton Eaton Associates of Morristown, in 1998. The Brintons' household consists of five Marotta children and 13 grandchildren, and three Brinton children and five grandchildren.



Dennis Bone

Combining a career in management for one of the world's premier communications companies with a record of leadership and commitment to public service makes Dennis Bone a natural choice for the Spirit of Edison Award for Community Leadership.

Elected president of Verizon New Jersey on June 30, 2000, Bone is responsible for all of the company's corporate interests in New Jersey. Prior to the Bell Atlantic/GTE merger, Bone was president and chief executive officer of Bell Atlantic-West Virginia, a position he held since 1995.

Bone started his Bell Atlantic (now Verizon) career in 1979 as an outside plant engineer for New Jersey Bell. He worked in operations, competitive assessment, rate planning and regulatory matters before being named vice president for external affairs for Bell Atlantic-New Jersey on March 1, 1993.

A 1973 graduate of the West Virginia University Institute of Technology, with a bachelor's degree in mathematics, Bone also holds a master of business administration degree in finance and economics from Rutgers University and a master of science degree in counseling from The Johns Hopkins University.

Among his many activities, Bone serves on the Board of Directors of the New Jersey State Chamber of Commerce, the New Jersey Utilities Association, the New Jersey Performing Arts Center and the Regional Business Partnership. He also serves on the Board of Trustees of the Newark Alliance, Liberty Science Center and the New Jersey Network Foundation. He is chairman of the West Virginia High Technology Consortium Foundation and chairman of the American Heart Association Essex County, New Jersey 2001 Heart Walk.

Bone and his wife, Denise, reside in Madison, N.J., with their three children, Allison, David and Austin.

S. John Quattrone



S. John Quattrone will be honored tonight with a special Spirit of Edison Award, the Family of Edison Award. It is his dedication to serving the Thomas Edison State College community and his devotion in improving the quality of higher education that has precipitated his selection as tonight's recipient of this special Spirit of Edison Award.

A member of the College "family" for more than 14 years, Quattrone has served on the College's Foundation Board of Directors since 1987 and has served as the treasurer of the Foundation Executive Committee since 1992. It is his enthusiastic "spirit" for Thomas Edison State College that has enabled him to engage board members to actively participate in the many spectacular events and fundraisers sponsored by the College over the years. Quattrone has provided leadership on many of the Foundation's committees including development, planned giving, executive and special events. He was the chairman of The Grande Ball – Trenton 2000 and worked on the Investing in Performance Campaign.

Quattrone, a Chartered Life Underwriter (CLU), is founder and president of S. John Quattrone Associates since 1957, an insurance and investment firm consulting in

the fields of employee benefit programs and estate planning. Quattrone's professional achievements extend from 1963 to the present as a Life and Qualifying Member of the Million Dollar Round Table. He has been president of both the Delaware Valley Association of Life Underwriters and the General Agents and Managers Association. He has been involved in the American College of Chartered Life Underwriters in addition to a number of other professional organizations.

Among his many civic activities, Quattrone's commitment to fighting cancer by increasing public awareness began in 1964 with his involvement first with the Mercer Unit and then with the New Jersey Unit of the American Cancer Society. Through hard work and continued efforts, Quattrone became president of the New Jersey Division and continues to serve on the Board of Directors of the newly formed Eastern Region of the American Cancer Society, the Executive Committee and the Finance Committee. He has been a member of numerous unit division and national committees and has served as committee chairs in most of them. Quattrone's biggest accomplishment with the American Cancer Society is serving as the National

Assembly Member representing the Eastern Region since 1995. He was also instrumental in setting up a legacy and planned giving program for the Philadelphia Branch of the Arthritis Foundation. He was a member of the Board and Executive Committee of the Young Men's Christian Association (Y.M.C.A.) from 1965 to 1976.

In 1991, Quattrone received the St. George Bronze Medal Award from the National Division of the American Cancer Society (the highest award given to volunteers) and the Mercer Unit's "Volunteer of the Year Award" presented at the Joyce McDade Memorial Ball. He was the recipient of the Italian American National Hall of Fame Humanitarian Award in 1993.

Quattrone and his wife, Bess, reside in Morrisville, Pa. They have three grown children, Bonny Rose, Rebecca Roxanne and A. John, and eight grandchildren.

Identified by Forbes magazine as one of the top 20 colleges and universities in the nation in the use of technology to create learning opportunities for adults, this accredited public college is an international leader in the assessment of adult learning and a pioneer in the use of educational technologies. Thomas Edison State College offers a distinguished academic program for the self-motivated adult learner.

The College offers the highest quality education to adults who have the inspiration, self-discipline and energy to complete degrees despite the many conflicting demands of career, family and community. Founded in 1972, this world-renowned institution offers 15 associate, baccalaureate and master's degrees in 100 major areas of study. Thomas Edison State College provides adults with a wide variety of ways to complete a quality degree, wherever they live or work.

Accredited by the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, Thomas Edison State College offers students the opportunity to earn degrees through traditional and nontraditional methods. These methods take into considera-

tion personal needs and interests while ensuring both breadth and depth of knowledge within the degree program. Students of Thomas Edison State College pursue degrees through a variety of rigorous academic venues, including documenting college-level knowledge they may already have as well as by completing independent study courses, Thomas Edison State College courses and examinations. Students may also earn college credit for learning acquired through military or corporate education programs, classroom courses at other accredited colleges and other high-quality credit-earning options designed for today's busy adult.

This year, the College has extended its reach around the globe with a number of exciting initiatives. In a groundbreaking agreement with one of the world's leading distance learning universities, Thomas Edison State College has entered into a far reaching partnership with the University of South Africa (UNISA). One of the oldest and largest universities in South Africa, UNISA is one of the most well respected purveyors of distance education in the world. The agreement will provide the College with access to an outstanding collection of distance education courses and opportunities to develop new joint degree programs, giving Thomas Edison State College students more high quality education options than ever before.

For nearly three decades, Thomas Edison State College has served

armed forces personnel worldwide by providing flexible education opportunities. The College's Military Degree Completion Program accommodates the special needs of military personnel whose location, relocation and time constraints make traditional college attendance difficult. The program allows students to pursue a college degree wherever they may be stationed. Thomas Edison State College is ideal for servicemembers who desire to use innovative instructional approaches rather than classroom-based courses.

As a result of this long-standing commitment to providing access to education options for military personnel, Thomas Edison State College has been chosen as a partner college for the U.S. Navy's new Navy College Rating Partnership Program. The program offers associate and baccalaureate degrees related to a sailor's occupational rating. Thomas Edison State College was chosen as one of the premier partners of this program because of the pioneering role it has played in developing military education degree

maps as well as career-related degrees with academic content grounded in military training and experience.

Helping students to achieve their educational goals has always been at the heart of the Thomas Edison State College mission. In addition to helping students around the world, the College is helping those closer to home. This year, the College announced the establishment of the Fred C. Rummel Scholarship Program to recognize and support the educational endeavors of five outstanding New Jersey community college graduates who plan to continue their studies towards a baccalaureate degree at Thomas Edison State College. Funded by the generous support of the Fred C. Rummel Foundation, this merit-based scholarship is the first of this size and scope to be offered by Thomas Edison State College.

The College has a long history of supporting county and community college students. Thomas Edison State College's Degree Pathways Program allows community and county college students to complete a baccalaureate degree without leaving their home counties and is available to every associate degree graduate from all New Jersey county and community colleges. This unique program offers two-year college graduates a seamless transfer to Thomas Edison State College's baccalaureate programs. Thomas Edison State College also has a partnership with Edison Community College in Fort Myers, Fla., and continues the process of developing other educational alliances throughout the country and around the world.

The corporate and business world is another arena where the College has established itself as a leader. For maximum flexibility and convenience, Thomas Edison State College works in tandem with more than 100 companies to evaluate corporate courses and to provide a college education to employees

without disrupting their personal or professional lives. Through the Office of Corporate-Higher Education Programs, Thomas Edison State College has assisted corporate clients since 1983. Working in conjunction with the American Council on Education (ACE) College Credit Recommendation Service, businesses are able to document the credit value of inservice programs, create tailored programs to meet employees' needs and accommodate the changing winds of the corporate culture through education with the help of Thomas Edison State College.

The College has left its mark in other areas of academia as well. The National Institute on the Assessment of Experiential Learning, created in 1989 as the only national program dedicated to advancing the field of experiential learning, annually attracts an impressive group of educators and practitioners from around the globe.

Thomas Edison State College not only leads the way in quality education for adult learners worldwide but also administers the New Jersey State Library, with which it became affiliated in 1996. It is also home to the John S. Watson Institute for Public Policy, which provides independent policy analysis and review to the public sector, nonprofit organizations and other clients. Furthermore, the College has partnered with the New Jersey Institute of Technology on HINT (Healthcare Information Networks and Technologies), a million-dollar study on the use of technology in the healthcare field. HINT recommendations have resulted in streamlined and reduced healthcare administrative costs.

Although governed by an appointed board of overseers, the College is host and home for two active outstanding volunteer leadership boards. The Thomas Edison State College Foundation Board of Directors serves as the primary fundraising and advocacy arm of the College. The Thomas Edison State

College Alumni Association is a vehicle for alumni advocacy, leadership and support. Each of these boards provides important business, civic and community promotion and resources for the College's programs and activities.

The depth of the College's accomplishments is a tribute to its staff and the leadership of three presidents: the late Dr. James Douglas Brown, Jr., the College's founding president (1972-1979); Dr. Lorraine R. A true visionary, Dr. Pruitt's leadership and guidance have made Thomas Edison State College one of the premier distance education institutions in the world. Honored by the Exxon Foundation as one of the nation's most effective college presidents, he was cited at the 1993 Thomas Edison State College Foundation Gala for outstanding service and unfailing dedication to the institution and its students.

Today, Thomas Edison State College's presence has expanded throughout the state's capitol city of Trenton. The College's campus embraces the Kelsey Building and the adjacent townhouse complex at 101 West State Street, the Academic Center at 167 East Hanover Street and the Kuser Mansion at 315 West State Street.
