


Foreword

The time spent at Trenton Junior College has drawn to a close but this episode in each of our lives will not soon be forgotten. Though graduation represents the finale of one phase of our lives, it is yet a beginning to another. As we depart from our present positions we are a step closer to our goals, for as the school has grown, we, as individuals, have grown also.

This school year, Trenton Junior College and School of Industrial Arts celebrated its Seventy-Fifth Anniversary having started as The Evening Drawing School in 1890. Eight years later its program was broadened to include courses geared to instruct people for growing industrialization and thus became the Trenton Technical School of Science and Art. Expanding still further to fit the community needs, it added the School of Industrial Arts in 1901, and finally became Trenton Junior College and School of Industrial Arts in 1947 when the necessity of academic facilities was realized.

The opportunities for development here at Trenton Junior College and School of Industrial Arts have been many and varied. There was afforded to each person the possibilities to grow both academically and socially. The close student-professor relationship, the high quality instruction presented, the sincere efforts of the faculty and administration in consoling the students—all within the atmosphere of a small college—have provided the student with an incentive enabling him to better utilize his capabilities and thus better direct himself.


Soccer
