



What a better way to inaugurate the Spirit of Edison awards than by honoring a contemporary "Renaissance man" who is a prolific inventor, musician and scientist? Frank Z. Hawrylo '79 is a distinguished research scientist and project engineer who holds 40 patents for inventions. In addition, his work has been included in more than 50 distinguished publications. A professional accordionist, he has performed for audiences around the world, including in a private audience with the Pope.

A resident of Mercerville, Frank has been one of the College's most active advocates since his graduation in 1979. A past president of the Alumni Association, he was the first recipient of the Alumni Association Award for Outstanding Service. Other recognition of his achievements includes the RCA Outstanding Achievement for Research Award in 1980 and the David Sarnoff Research Center Outstanding Achievement Award in 1987.

A research scientist with RCA for more than 30 years, he is currently a project engineer leader with Laser Diode Products, Inc., New Brunswick. But in addition to an enviable career at the cutting edge of science and technology, Frank has an even greater source of strength, inspiration and pride: he and his wonderful wife, Elizabeth, have six children and four grandchildren.


EMBODYING THE SPIRIT OF EDISON

The Thomas Edison State College Foundation is pleased to present the first Spirit of Edison awards. These prestigious awards recognize both a graduate and a community leader whose creativity, commitment and entrepreneurial spirit reflect the pioneering genius of Thomas Alva Edison.

The first recipients are Frank Z. Hawrylo '79 and John P. Neary, who set an outstanding standard for future Spirit of Edison award winners.

The entire College family of students, alumni, trustees, board directors, faculty, staff and administrators extends its heartiest congratulations to these two outstanding citizens.



CAPTURING THE SPIRIT OF EDISON THE MAN, THOMAS EDISON THE COLLEGE

How do you capture the spirit of a man who made more than 50,000 attempts to create the incandescent light bulb? Who was issued 1,000 patents over a distinguished career? Who labored tirelessly in his lab to produce revolutionary inventions which today are taken for granted as necessities of modern life (like the phonograph)? How is it possible to personify the genius of a man who did all this through self-directed learning?

Throughout New Jersey, the nation and the world, the spirit of that genius lives on in Thomas Edison State College, a true "original" in higher education. Like the first rays of light from Edison's fledgling light bulb, the College, since its inception 22 years ago, has illuminated a path to higher learning for more than 10,000 adult learners.

Since Thomas Edison State College conferred its first Associate in Arts degree in July 1972, more than 10,000 associate and baccalaureate degrees have been awarded. The College currently offers the Bachelor and Associate in Arts, Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, Associate in Science in Management, Bachelor and Associate in Science in Applied Science and Technology, Bachelor of Science in Human Services, Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Associate in Science in Public and Social Services, Associate in Science in Natural Sciences and Math and Associate in Applied Science in Radiologic Technology. Edison would be proud of the growth of his namesake, which also enabled him to earn a posthumous degree: the Bachelor of Science in Applied Science and Technology with a specialization in Electrical Technology in 1992. This is

an earned, not an honorary degree, based on Edison's extraordinary life and the wealth of documented work he left behind.

OPENING DOORS

Opening doors of access to students has always been at the heart of the Thomas Edison State College mission. Distance technologies such as Guided Study courses, which can be taken at home and on the new On-Line Computer Classroom, where students and faculty "meet" on the screens of their personal computers, bring the highest quality education to adults wherever they live and work. The College's Computer Assisted Lifelong Learning (CALL) Network, called "one of the brighter stars of higher learning" this year by *The New York Times*, enables adults to inquire, apply, enroll, access records, "chat" with advisors and take



advantage of many other services using a personal computer and a modem.

The latest portal of access to Thomas Edison's pioneering services is the New Jersey Baccalaureate Degree Completion Program (NJBDCP). Created to meet the need for four-year college services in the southern regions of New Jersey, NJBDCP has quickly spread throughout the state. Currently, six county colleges - Atlantic, Camden, Cumberland, Gloucester, Morris and Ocean - have signed-on to this unique program that offers two-year college graduates a seamless transfer to Thomas Edison's baccalaureate programs.

Reaching out to the business community is another way Thomas Edison State College provides access to men and women seeking a college degree. Through the Center for Corporate and Public Partnerships, Thomas Edison has cultivated corporate clients since 1983. Working through the Office of Corporate Programs and in conjunction with PONSI (Program on Noncollegiate Sponsored Instruction), businesses are able to document the credit value of their inservice programs, create tailored programs to meet their employees' needs and accommodate the changing winds of the corporate culture through education. For the past few years, a Corporate-Higher Education Colloquium has been held to bring together experts from across the nation to further these beneficial partnerships.

REACHING OUT TO OTHERS

Thomas Edison State College has left its mark in other areas of academia, as well. The National Institute on the Assessment of Experiential Learning, created in 1989 as the only national program dedicated to advancing the field of experiential learning, annually attracts an impressive group of educators from around the globe.




Locally, the Trenton Office of Policy Studies (TOPS) partners Thomas Edison with the city of Trenton in a unique collegiate-municipal collaboration to analyze emerging public policy issues which impact the city, and to formulate recommendations and plans for addressing municipal problems. Its leadership and commitment to both public service and higher education has garnered TOPS several local, state and national awards. The College is also working with the city through the Trenton Management Review Commission to provide private/public support in undertaking management review of city operations to improve the productivity of Trenton government.

The College assisted the state of New Jersey by loaning an executive to serve as the first director of the Governor's Management Review Commission. The Commission was charged with undertaking a statewide audit of government, which resulted in recommendations saving \$1.8 billion to New Jersey citizens. Also on the state level, the College has partnered with the New Jersey Institute of Technology on the

HINT (Healthcare Information Network Technologies), a million dollar study on utilizing technology in the delivery of healthcare to make recommendations that will result in streamlining and reducing healthcare administrative costs.

GLORIOUS PAST, PROMISING FUTURE

During its impressive tenure, the College has had only three presidents. The first was Dr. James Douglas Brown, Jr., who served from the College's original offices on North Olden Avenue in Ewing Township. Dr. Larraine R. Matusak succeeded Dr. Brown in 1978, shortly before the College's move to the historic Kelsey Building on West State Street in Trenton. Twelve years ago, Dr. George A. Pruitt accepted the appointment as president. It is Dr. Pruitt who has not only charted the course, but also has steered the College toward the future. Honored by the Exxon Foundation as one of the nation's most effective college presidents, he was cited for outstanding service and unfailing dedication to the institution and its students during his 10th year with the College.



The College, its leadership and programs are a tribute to its illustrious history. Even the Kelsey Building is alive with history. Originally built by Henry Cooper Kelsey, a banker and politician with an appreciation for artisans, the Kelsey

Building is a dedication to his wife, Prudence Townsend Kelsey, who died in 1904. The building was dedicated in 1911 as a school for Industrial Arts. In 1979, when Thomas Edison was looking to move from its cramped office spaces in the Forrestal Center outside of Princeton, the state was looking for an appropriate tenant for the landmark Kelsey Building, while the city sought to preserve the building's historic use as a school. All three concerns were brought together when state Senate President Joseph P. Merlino persuaded Gov. Brendan T. Byrne that the brick brownstones, along with the Kelsey Building, were ideal for College expansion. At a time when developers were threatening the residential character of the State House Historic District, that marriage of the block's architectural gem and its less showy neighbors satisfied the College, the state and the city.

Today, Thomas Edison State College's presence has expanded throughout the city and the state. The College's Trenton campus embraces the Academic Center at 167 E. Hanover St. and the Kuser Mansion at 315 W. State St., home of Admissions Services, Public Policy Studies, the Center for Corporate and Public Partnerships, Human Resources and Distance & Independent Adult Learning. The College also maintains offices in Newark and Camden. But, like the irrepressible spirit of the man himself, Thomas Edison State College isn't contained by bricks and mortar. The College's reach is felt by the flight engineer in Hawaii who completes her assignments on her laptop at 20,000 feet ... by the working mother who logs on after her kids have gone to bed ... by the business executive who never quite finished his degree while climbing to the top of the corporate ladder ... and by countless others whose will and determination keep Thomas Edison State College at the forefront of progressive higher education.



Congratulations to Frank Hawrylo & Jack Neary

The recipients of the First Annual "Spirit of Edison" Awards






