TRENTON JUNIOR COLLEGE



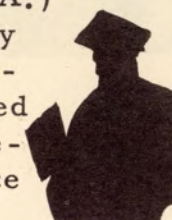

This past season the Trenton Junior College Basketball Team sported the best record in school history.

Captained by Fennelli and Krysa, the Vikings highlighted the season by scoring 129 points in a single game, and over 100 points in two other occasions.

The state individual scoring record was topped this year by Jim Fennelli, who sank 46 points in one event. Trenton captured the state title again for the third consecutive season. Fennelli and Schipske were named to the All-State Team.

The Vikings also represented Region 15 in the N.J.C.A.A. Tournament held in Hutchinson, Kansas. In their first game against Campbell J.C. of South Carolina, T.J.C. lost a tough one by the score of 66-63, and then lost a heart-breaker to Centralia, Illinois with a last second field goal, making the score 74-72.
