Thomas A. Bracken

Recognized as a leader in the financial community and well known for his involvement in business and community organizations, Thomas A. Bracken is being honored with the Spirit of Edison Award for Community Leadership.

Named president and chief executive officer of the Sun Bancorp, Inc. in February of 2001, Bracken leads the bank holding company that serves customers throughout the region. Headquartered in Vineland, N.J., Sun Bancorp has 73 Community Banking Centers and six Regional Banking Headquarters located in southern and central New Jersey, New Castle County, Del. and in Philadelphia, Pa.

Actively involved in the community, Bracken was appointed by Gov. Christine Todd Whitman to the Board of Trustees for the College of New Jersey. He is the vice chairman of the New Jersey Chamber of Commerce and serves on the Executive Committee. Bracken is chairman of both the Keep New Jersey Moving Coalition and the Economic Development Corporation of Trenton, and

has held the position of President of the Northern New Jersey chapter of Robert Morris Associates.

In addition, Bracken currently serves on the Board of Directors for the New Jersey Alliance for Action, is chairman of the Finance Committee for the New Jersey Cancer Institute and serves on the Board of Directors of New Jersey Network (NJN). He is also a member of the Executive Committee of Prosperity New Jersey, serving as the organization's treasurer since June 2001, and cochairs their Business Ambassadors Program.

Bracken and his wife Suzanne are the parents of two children.

Bonnie Watson Goleman, 85

A tireless advocate for civil rights, children and the disadvantaged, Bonnie Watson Coleman will be honored tonight as the recipient of the Spirit of Edison Award for Distinguished Alumni. Watson Coleman graduated from Thomas Edison State College with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1985.

Watson Coleman has served in the New Jersey General Assembly for three terms. She was the first African-American woman to lead the State party when she was elected chair of the New Jersey Democratic State Committee on February 4, 2002. She currently serves as the chair of the Assembly Appropriations Committee and is a member of the Assembly Budget Committee.

Hailed as New Jersey's most outspoken and insightful legislators, Watson Coleman began her career as a field representative for the New Jersey Division on Civil Rights and quickly rose through the ranks to become chief of the Bureau of Housing and Public Accommodations. During her thirty-year career, she has

championed the issues of fairness and equity for all Americans, with particular emphasis on access to education, jobs, healthcare, open space and housing.

In 1974, Watson Coleman established the Office of Civil Rights, Contract Compliance and Affirmative Action in the New Jersey Department of Transportation and remained the director of that office for six years. In 1980, Watson Coleman joined the Department of Community Affairs, where she held a number of positions including assistant commissioner; responsible for Aging, Community Resources, Public Guardian and Women's Divisions.

Watson Coleman resides in Ewing Township with her husband, Minister William E. Coleman.

Thomas Edison State College is celebrating its 30th Anniversary of providing quality higher education for adults. One of New Jersey's 12 senior public institutions of higher education, Thomas Edison State College provides adults from every state and 84 other nations with access to the best choices in higher education. The College offers educational opportunities to adults who have the inspiration, self-discipline and energy to complete degrees while attending to the demands of family, career and community.

Identified by Forbes magazine as one of the top 20 colleges and universities in the nation in the use of technology to create learning opportunities for adults, this accredited public college is an international leader in the assessment of adult learning and a pioneer in the use of educational technologies. Founded in 1972, this world-renowned institution offers 14 associate, baccalaureate and master's degrees in more than 100 areas of study.


Thomas Edison State College offers students the opportunity to earn degrees through traditional and nontraditional methods. These methods take into consideration personal needs and interests while ensuring both breadth and depth of knowledge within the degree program. Students of Thomas Edison State College pursue degrees through a variety of rigorous academic venues, including documenting college-level knowledge they may already have as well as by completing independent study courses, Thomas Edison State College courses and examinations. Students may also

earn college credit for learning acquired through military or corporate education programs, classroom courses at other accredited colleges and other high-quality credit-earning options designed for today's busy adult.

Accredited by the Commission on Higher Education of the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, the College had its 10-year re-accreditation visit by the Middle States Evaluation Team in April. The team's report not only affirmed the College's re-accreditation but celebrated its outstanding accomplishments.

For three decades, Thomas Edison State College has served armed forces personnel worldwide by providing flexible education opportunities. The College's Military Degree Completion Program accommodates the special needs of military personnel whose location, re-location and time constraints make traditional college attendance difficult. The program allows students to pursue a college degree wherever they may be stationed. Thomas Edison State College is ideal for servicemembers who desire to use innovative instructional approaches rather than classroom-based courses.

As a result of this long-standing commitment of providing access to education options for military personnel, Thomas Edison State College is one of the colleges chosen to participate in the Navy College Program Distance Learning Partnership, created by the U.S. Navy in response to sailors' needs for greater access to higher education and is a participant in the eArmyU program, which enables U.S. enlisted soldiers to obtain



professional technical certifications and associate, baccalaureate and master's degrees using laptop computers to access online courses while they serve in the Army.

Helping students achieve their educational goals has always been at the heart of the Thomas Edison State College mission. In addition to helping students around the world, the College is helping those closer to home. This year, the College awarded three new scholarships through the Fred C. Rummel Scholars Program and renewed the four scholarships awarded last year. Funded by the generous support of the Fred C. Rummel Foundation, this merit-based scholarship is the first of this size and scope to be offered by Thomas Edison State College. It is designed to recognize and support the educational endeavors of outstanding New Jersey community college graduates who plan to continue their studies toward a baccalaureate degree at Thomas Edison State College.

The College has a long history of supporting county and community college students. Thomas Edison State College's Degree Pathways Program allows community and county college students to complete a baccalaureate degree without leaving their home counties and is available to every

associate degree graduate from all New Jersey county and community colleges. This unique program offers two-year college graduates a seamless transfer to Thomas Edison State College's baccalaureate degree programs.

Thomas Edison State College also has partnerships with the University of South Africa (UNISA) in Pretoria—one of the most well respected purveyors of distance education in the world; Edison Community College in Fort Myers, Fla., and Bucks County Community College in Newtown, Pa., and continues the process of developing other educational alliances throughout the country and around the world.

The corporate and business world is another arena where the College has established itself as a leader. For maximum flexibility and convenience, Thomas Edison State College works in tandem with more than 100 companies to evaluate corporate courses and to provide a college education to employees without disrupting their personal or professional lives. Through the Office of Corporate-Higher Education Programs, Thomas Edison State College has assisted corporate clients since 1983. Working in conjunction with the American Council on Education (ACE) College Credit Recommendation Service, businesses are able to document the credit value of inservice programs, create tailored programs to meet employees' needs and accommodate the changing winds of the corporate culture through education with the help of Thomas Edison State College.

This year the College has undertaken a number of exciting initiatives.
Thomas Edison State College and The Chubb Institute have developed a partnership to facilitate degree completion for adults who have completed The Chubb Institute courses that have been recommended for college credit by ACE. The agreement allows students to apply their ACE credit recommendations, earned for The Chubb Institute courses successfully completed, to specific degree requirements at Thomas Edison State College. A part-

nership agreement has also been signed with Mortgage Bankers
Association of America to facilitate degree completion for adults who have earned ACE credit recommendations for courses that they have completed successfully through CampusMBA.

The College has left its mark in other areas of academia as well. The National Institute on the Assessment of Experiential Learning, created in 1989 as the only national program dedicated to advancing the field of experiential learning, annually attracts an impressive group of educators and practitioners from around the globe.

Thomas Edison State College not only leads the way in quality education for adults, it is also a leader in service to the community. The College is affiliated with the New Jersey State Library and is home to the John S. Watson Institute for Public Policy, which provides independent policy analysis and review to the public sector, nonprofit organizations and other clients. Furthermore, the College has partnered with the New Jersey Institute of Technology on Healthcare Information Networks and Technologies (HINT), a million-dollar study on the use of technology in the healthcare field. HINT recommendations have resulted in streamlined and reduced healthcare administrative costs.

Governed by an appointed board of trustees, the College is also host and home for two active outstanding volunteer leadership boards. The Thomas Edison State College Foundation Board of Directors serves as the primary fundraising and advocacy arm of the College and the Thomas Edison State College Alumni Association is a vehicle for alumni advocacy, leadership and support. Each of these boards provide important business, civic and community promotion and resources for the College's programs and activities.

The depth of the College's accomplishment is a tribute to its staff and the leadership of three presidents. The late Dr. James Douglas Brown, Jr., the College's founding president (1972-1979), Dr. Larraine R. Matusak (1979-

1982) and Dr. George A. Pruit (1982-present), who is celebrating his 20th anniversary as the College's leader.

A true visionary, Dr. Pruitt's leadership and guidance have made Thomas Edison State College one of the premier institutions of quality higher education nationally and internationally. Honored by the Exxon Foundation as one of the nation's most effective college presidents, he was cited at the 1993 Thomas Edison State College Foundation Gala for outstanding service and unfailing dedication to the institution and its students. This year, U.S. Secretary of Education Rodney Paige has re-appointed Dr. Pruitt to a three-year term on the National Advisory Committee on Institutional Quality and Integrity and New Jersey Gov. James E. McGreevey appointed Dr. Pruitt to the newly formed Education Cabinet.

Today, Thomas Edison State College's presence has expanded throughout the state's capital city of Trenton. The College's campus embraces the Kelsey Building at 101 W. State St., and the adjacent townhouse complex, the Academic Center at 167 E. Hanover St. and the Kuser Mansion at 315 W. State St. The recently completed renovations on five historic townhouses has enabled the College to acquire 21st-century technology, from electronic classrooms and computer labs to a corporate-style education conference room and other facilities linking students and mentors at dozens of colleges throughout the country and around the world.

Thomas Edison State College is proud of the opportunities it has had to help adult students achieve their educational goals. As the College continues to evolve and grow, it will pursue new and unprecedented ways to provide the highest quality education for new generations of motivated adults who are seeking college degrees.
