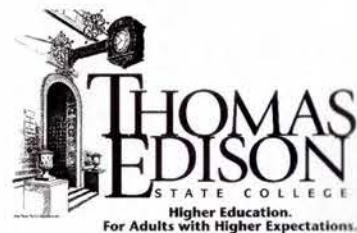

### Thomas Edison State College and USDA's Graduate School Create Master's Degree with Public Sector Auditing Focus

Thomas Edison State College and the Graduate School of the United States Department of Agriculture's Government Audit Training Institute (GATI) have partnered to establish a comprehensive program leading to a Master of Science in Management degree with a focus in public sector auditing. The program is now open for applications and the new GATI courses offer a new degree opportunity for public sector auditors.

The degree program is designed to meet the needs of individuals engaged in conducting performance audits in the public sector. While it is anticipated that the majority of participants will be federal, state and local government auditors, the program is also designed to meet the needs of the private sector employee engaged in government audits.

"For too many years, the needs of the public sector auditor and government audit organizations have been overlooked," said Peter V. Aliferis, dean of curriculum of the Government Auditing Training Institute. "This program is structured to fill that gap."

Aliferis noted that the Master of Science in Management - Public Sector Auditing (MSM-PSA) program will have wide appeal among federal, state and local auditors from both the United States and abroad. The degree incorporates academic coursework, training and practical experience related to professional competencies. These competencies include: environment, professional expertise, communication, leadership and personal effectiveness.

"The Master of Science in Management degree in public sector auditing program offers a unique opportunity for public sector auditors," said Dr. Sonja A. Eveslage, dean of Graduate Programs at Thomas Edison State College. "GATI is well-known for the quality of its auditing programs and its preparation of auditors in the highest level positions. GATI's quality face-to-face courses integrate well with the online curriculum the MSM degree program provides."

Special assignment and assessment tools have been integrated into GATI's classes to evaluate performance in these programs. In addition, according to Aliferis, the new special seminar for public sector auditors and the competency assessment portfolio will further ensure the academic rigor of the MSM-PSA program.

"Thomas Edison State College graduate students live across the country and around the world," said Eveslage. "The MSM degree program builds collaboration and networking into the online courses. Students build relationships that work for them in class and in their professional lives."

### DR. JOSEPH YOUNGBLOOD II APPOINTED EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE JOHN S. WATSON INSTITUTE FOR PUBLIC POLICY

Dr. Joseph Youngblood II of Philadelphia, Pa., has been appointed executive director of The John S. Watson Institute for Public Policy.

Youngblood, previously an associate fellow and most recently a consultant with the Watson Institute, will oversee the nonpartisan independently funded research office whose mission is to provide public policy analysis and other assistance to government, community groups and the private sector. He is succeeding William A. Watson, who retired from the post in January.

In announcing the appointment, Dr. George A. Pruitt, president of Thomas Edison State College said, "Joe Youngblood has demonstrated exemplary leadership in education, in government and in the community. The College will benefit from the knowledge and expertise he brings to the Watson Institute."

An educator and administrator with a background in law, research and counseling, Youngblood brings more than 15 years of experience to the Watson Institute. Prior to this appointment, Youngblood was director of School Based Youth Services with the Trenton Board of Education as well as Trenton grant coordinator and project director of Leadership for Education Achievement in Districts (L.E.A.D.).

"Dr. Youngblood brings extraordinary qualifications to the task of providing vision and leadership for the Watson Institute and its public policy partnerships," said John P. Thurber, vice president for Public Affairs at Thomas Edison State College. "He is ideally suited to build on the pioneering work of Bill Watson in applying the resources of higher education to serve our communities."

Youngblood holds a Ph.D. in education, culture & society from the University of Pennsylvania Graduate School of Education in the Education Leadership Division in Philadelphia, a J.D. from the University of Iowa College of Law in Iowa City, Iowa, an M.A. in education administration from the University of Iowa College of Education and a B.S. in political science and English literature from Florida A&M University in Tallahassee, Fla.

# Technological Advancement College's Course Development EXPANDS Thanks to the "D-Team"

There are not very many people who can truly get excited about an algebra test, but Thomas Edison State College's Dr. Henry van Zyl is one such individual. As the associate vice president for the College's Center for Distance & Independent Adult Learning (DIAL), van Zyl oversees all aspects of course development. According to van Zyl, while the College is making a big commitment toward increasing the number of online courses available to students, the development of mathematics courses has proven to be the most exhilarating task.

"The work we've done in the development of the math and accounting courses has been the most exciting," said van Zyl. When work is completed, it will be the first time that these types of courses will be offered online. Van Zyl credits DIAL's "D-Team," a group comprised of four instructional designers, an exam project manager, and an academic editor, for the success they've achieved in this area.

"We had to resolve a number of issues as we approached this project," said van Zyl. For example, the grading of assignments and feedback from mentors plays a major role in the learning process for math and accounting students. In the typical classroom setting, the student would hand write the notation on paper and turn it in to the instructor, who would assign a grade based on the student's demonstrated understanding of the processes involved in solving a math or accounting computation.

"The challenge for us was to enable the student to write notation using a software application," said van Zyl. "We had to ensure that the student would be able to show the different steps involved in solving the problem, be able to send the assignment via the internet to a mentor, who will open the electronic file, grade it and send it back to the student without any of the file transfers becoming garbled."

Always on the lookout for ideas, van Zyl found that students often came up with electronic methods to write notation on their own. "Our students have been ingenious," he said. During his research, van Zyl found some of the students were able to use various software applications to demonstrate notation. As a result, DIAL has identified ways that will allow the students to demonstrate their math and accounting knowledge in an electronic format. "This is quite a big breakthrough for us," said van Zyl. The first online mathematics courses became available to Thomas Edison State College students beginning with the March 2003 semester.

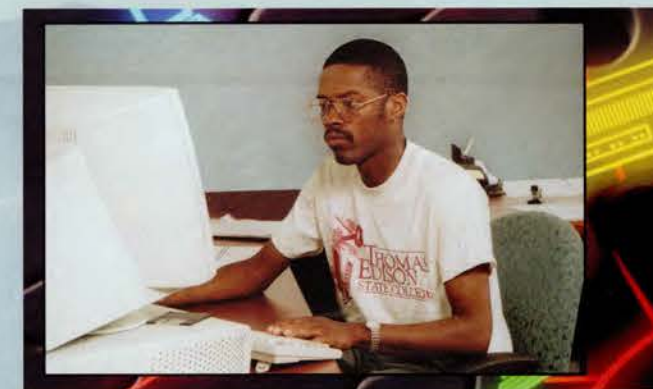


## New Advances in Test Development

DIAL has recently launched significant initiatives in the area of test development. Under the direction of Dr. James Lehman, the staff recently announced a new pilot program for the TECEP® program. Students who take their tests at the College's testing facility in Trenton, N.J. may now take the "Principles of Management" TECEP® exam on a desktop computer. Dubbed the e-TECEP, the electronic version of the exam features the same questions and costs no more than a regular TECEP® exam, however, there are advantages to the new e-TECEP. Students receive their test score immediately upon completion of the exam. In addition, students will be given sub-scores for each topic area, which will help them to assess their strengths and weaknesses. The Office of Test Development & Independent Study hopes to offer additional e-TECEP exams after the pilot program is completed.

Another new development made available to students during this past year is the introduction of "Test Scheduler." The new service allows students coming to the testing facility in Trenton to schedule test dates from their own personal computer instead of having to telephone the Office of Test Administration. This new Web option allows students to view all available test dates for a specific semester, book a test time and date for each of their courses and receive an e-mail confirmation to verify their test date.

Another timesaving development is the introduction of newly designed test cover sheets. All undergraduate exams have new and highly functional covers. A barcode label on each exam will link to new scanning software in the




Office of Test Administration. The purpose of the labels is twofold: to speed the processing of exams once they are returned to the College and to provide information that will ensure that students take the correct exam. Information on each label includes the mentor's name, proctor, course code, title and semester, and the student name and ID number.

## Online Courses Increasing in Popularity

Course development will play an important part in the growth of the College's online programs. According to van Zyl, to date his office has

converted 65 of the 118 Guided Study courses to online offerings. "Our goal is to have 100 percent of all Thomas Edison State College courses available online," said van Zyl.

The online courses have proven to be very popular with students. "Our work has been paying off," said van Zyl. "The number of students taking the online courses has increased. Students like the fact that they can complete an online course via the Internet in 12 weeks instead of the 16 weeks that it takes to complete a Guided Study course through the mail."

As part of his research, van Zyl monitors the online student discussion boards at the College. "It's nice to see the positive comments that the students make about our courses," he said. Students are trying the new courses, liking them and telling other students to try them out. "One student even wrote that online classes were as close to the real thing as you can get," said van Zyl, who says that kind of feedback is music to the "D-Team's" ears.

## Martinson Family Foundation Grant Funds Technology Course

Thanks to a generous grant from the Martinson Family Foundation of Lawrenceville, N.J., Thomas Edison State College will be developing a Web-based, interactive course in computer science that will be used in the Bachelor of Science in Applied Science and Technology degree program.

"Interactivity will be a prominent feature of the new course," said William S. Seaton, vice president and provost at Thomas Edison State College. "We will utilize computer applets such as Java, Micromedia, Flash and other applications. The courses will be available through BlackBoard, the learning management system the College uses to deliver its courses via the World Wide Web."

Seaton also reported that the College is considering the use of high bandwidth applications in the development of additional courses. Such media would be delivered to students via CD-ROM that interfaces with the College's Web server, modeling the College's Master of Science in Management (MSM) degree program that is successfully in use. "Distance education is what distinguishes Thomas Edison State College from other institutions of higher learning," said Seaton. "We would like to thank our friends at the Martinson Family Foundation for their assistance and support of this effort."

### DIAL Developing Online Courses for New Fitness and Wellness Services Program

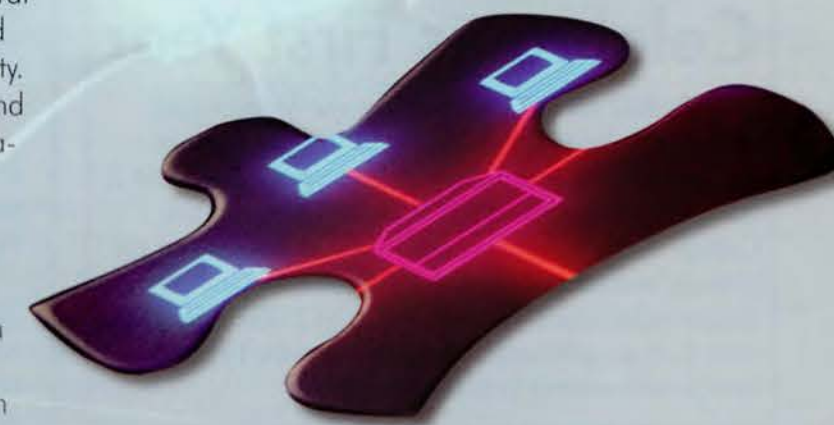
Since the program was announced at the Curves annual conference in November, the Thomas Edison State College Office of Admissions has seen an increased volume in inquiries for the degree program

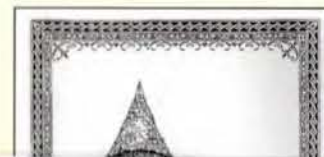

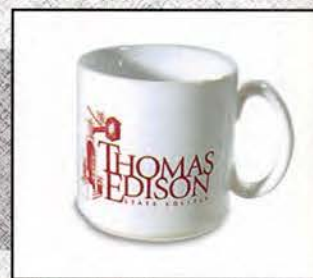
