




Rita A. Novitt will be honored tonight with a special Spirit of Edison Award—the Family of Edison Award. A strong supporter of higher education in general, Rita's unfailing dedication to Thomas Edison State College and her exemplary service to its Boards are the true measure of "spirit" for which the award was designed.

A member of the College "family" for over 17 years, Rita has served on the College's Foundation Board of Directors since 1990. She served for 10 years as a member of the Board of Trustees, during which period the Board appointed Dr. George Pruitt as the College's third president. It was, however, her enthusiastic "spirit" for Thomas Edison State College that has enabled her to engage board members to actively create very spectacular events over the years.

RITA A. NOVITT

Rita provided the leadership for the College's 20th Anniversary and 25th Anniversary galas, and for Dr. Pruitt's 10th Anniversary Celebration at the Camden Aquarium. She contributed tirelessly to the College's history project on the occasion of its 25th Anniversary. She even visited with Thomas Edison State College alumni around the country while on personal vacations. Most recently, she met with alumni in Santa Fe, N.M.

In addition to her Thomas Edison activities, Rita's dedication to higher education includes her association with Douglass College. She is the president of the Middlesex County Alumnae Association of Douglass College, Rutgers University, and the vice president of the Douglass College Alumnae Association. She served as the chairperson of Douglass College's 50th Anniversary Celebration.

Among her many other activities, Rita is on the executive committees of the Board of Directors of the United Way and the Board of Directors, George Washington Council, Boy Scouts of America. She is on the Board of Trustees of the New Brunswick Cultural Center and State Theater Operating Committee. This

type of dedication has garnered her much recognition. In 1989, she was inducted into the Douglass Honor Society, Douglass College, Rutgers University, in recognition of Career and Community Development. She received the Distinguished Service Award from Thomas Edison State College in 1990. Rita has been featured in Who's Who of American Women.

A retired executive with Johnson & Johnson, Rita is a consultant for W. K. Kellogg Foundation Review Team for the National Fellowship Program. She lives in Princeton, N.J.



RABBI DR. MARC JORDAN BEN-MEIR 184



Despite learning disabilities that forced him to drop out of high school, Dr. Marc Jordan Ben-Meir has demonstrated perseverance and persistence which has garnered him four college degrees, a number of licenses and certifications and ordination as a rabbi. He turned his knowledge into a distinguished career as a counselor and psychologist serving individuals in need of help, including parolees, and battered women and children. It is his dedication to serving the public good and his devotion to improving the quality of life that has precipitated his selection as tonight's alumni recipient of the Spirit of Edison Award.

Marc, who has dyslexia, dropped out of high school in 1963. He completed a vocational diploma in 1965, and, after serving in the U.S. Army for four years, wandered around Europe for nine months. He finally settled in Israel and stayed there until 1973. While learning Hebrew, Marc overcame his dyslexia and started to read voraciously.

When he returned to the states, Marc re-entered the army. Studying evenings while working full time as an Army recruiter, Marc completed an associate's degree and graduated from Thomas Edison State College in 1984 with his B.A. Marc went on to complete his M.A. (cum laude) in Organizational Behavior and his Ph.D. in Organizational Psychology. His published dissertation on criminal behavior is used in many prisons in Texas.

Owner and operator of the Springhaven Clinic in Fort Worth, Texas, Marc is licensed as a chemical dependency counselor and social worker associate, and is certified in such areas as clinical hypnotherapy and addictions counseling.

Among his many honors and awards, Marc is a published poet. He was the American Poetry Association's "Poet of the Year" in 1989 and was honored "Poet Laureate" by the National Library of Poetry in 1996.

Marc has accumulated four college degrees, licenses, certifications and other assorted honors, yet he still wears his Thomas Edison State College class ring. He and his wife, Tina, live in North Richland Hills, Texas. They are the parents of five children.

DR. SUREN N. SEH9AL

Combining a career as a research pharmacologist and immunologist for one of the world's leading research companies with a record of leadership and commitment to public health and wellness makes Dr. Suren N. Sehgal a natural choice for the Spirit of Edison Award.

A world authority on immunosuppression therapy for patients receiving human organ transplants, Suren is a Distinguished Research Fellow for Wyeth-Averst Research, a Division of American Home Products Corporation, Suren obtained his B.Pharm and M.Pharm from Banaras University in Banaras, India, in 1953, and his Ph.D. in microbiology and immunology from Bristol University in Bristol, England, in 1958. Suren did his postdoctoral fellowship at the National Research Council of Canada, after which, he joined Ayerst Research Laboratories in Montreal, Canada. He moved to Princeton, N.J., with Ayerst Research as associate director of Immunology. In 1987, following the merger of Ayerst Research and Wyeth Laboratories, Suren was promoted to senior research fellow of the new Wyeth-Ayerst

Research organization. He was promoted to his present position in 1995.

Suren is the recipient of several awards for his work on drug discovery and development. In 1990, Suren received the Wyeth-Ayerst Discovery and Development Award. He received the Exceptional Achievement Award in 1993 and the Wyeth Clinical Recognition Award in 1995. In 1997, Suren was honored with the Lifetime Achievement Award by Indian Society of Organ Transplantation and was elected to the fellowship of American Academy of Microbiology.

Suren's seminal contribution is the discovery and development of a new drug that blocks the rejection of transplanted organs. The drug, Rapamune® (sirolimus), is in the last phase of clinical studies and holds the promise of better quality of life for the transplant recipients.



Among his many other activities, Suren is a member of the International Consensus Panel on Immunosuppressive Drugs, the Transplantation Society, the American Society for Microbiology and the Society for Industrial Microbiology. He also is a reviewer for Transplantation: Journal of Transplantation Society and a section editor for Principles of Drug Development in Transplantation and Autoimmunity, R. G. Landers, 1996. Suren has numerous publications and articles in his field and is a much-soughtafter lecturer on the subject.

Suren and his wife, Uma, live in Princeton. They are the parents of two children, and have five grandchildren.

The preservation of the 19thcentury structures, with some of the nation's finest Greek Revival interiors, will enable the College to acquire 21st-century technology, from electronic classrooms and computer labs to a corporate-style education conference room and other facilities linking students and faculty at dozens of colleges throughout the country and around the world.

Thomas Edison State College, however, isn't contained by bricks and mortar. The College's reach is felt by all those who dare to turn the impossible dream of a college degree into reality.
