

The visions of three brilliant educators and administrators have led Thomas Edison State College down the path to excellence. Three leaders put the College on the map, enabling thousands of adults to fulfill the dream of a college education. Tonight, the College thanks and honors them for making a college for adult learners not only a reality, but a success.

GEORGE A. PRUITT 1982 - PRESENT

During his 10-year presidency, Dr. George A. Pruitt has amassed an impressive record of professional achievement and community service. He has been a strong and respected leader at Thomas Edison State College while unselfishly giving his time to assist people and organizations in achieving their goals.

Many programs have come to life at Thomas Edison State College since 1982, including the Center for Corporate and Public Partnerships, the Trenton Office of Policy Studies, the National Institute for the Assessment of Experiential Learning, the Thomas Edison State College Foundation, the Computer Assisted Lifelong Learning (CALL) Network and the CALL-PC program for disadvantaged students.

His many professional and civic activities include: the Governor's Economic Conference Work Force Quality Task Force; the Commission on Educational Credit and Credentials of the American Council on Education (ACE); the Labor/Higher Education Council of ACE; the boards of trustees of The Woods Schools in Langhorne, Pa., and The Union Institute in Cincinnati, Ohio; and the boards of directors of The National Prepaid Tuition Plan, Mercer County Chamber of Commerce, Mercer Medical Center and the New Jersey Association of College's and Universities.

Dr. Pruitt's many awards and honors include the Humanitarian Award from the Greater Princeton Area National Conference of Christians and Jews and recognition as One of the Most Effective College Presidents in the United States by the Exxon Education Foundation in 1986. He holds B.S. and M.S. degrees from Illinois State University and a Ph.D. in higher education administration from the Graduate School of The Union Institute.

LARRAINE R. MATUSAK 1978 - 1982



Dr. Matusak is currently coordinator/program director for the W.K. Kellogg Foundation of Battle Creek, Mich., a post she has held since leaving the presidency of Thomas Edison State College in 1982. For more than 30 years, she was a professor and administrator in secondary and postsecondary education. During that time, she served as dean of the College of Alternative Programs at the University of Evansville in Indiana and professor of natural sciences at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis.

She holds many professional appointments with regional and national education organizations. She also serves as president of the board of S.A.F.E. Place in Battle Creek; is vice chair of the board of trustees of the College of St. Benedict, St. Joseph, Minn.; and board member of the Battle Creek Symphony. She was the recipient of the Outstanding American Educator award from the Medical College of Georgia in Augusta in 1974.

Dr. Matusak has authored numerous publications in the field of nontraditional adult education and leadership. She received her bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry from the College of St. Benedict and a master's degree in entomology from the University of Minnesota. Her doctorate in higher education administration was earned at the Fielding Institute of Graduate Studies.

JAMES D. BROWN, JR. 1972 - 1978



Dr. Brown served at Thomas Edison State College's first president, a position he held for six years. After leaving the presidency of Thomas Edison, he returned to a full-time professoriate in Connecticut.

Prior to his tenure at Thomas Edison State College, Dr. Brown was director, Executive Programs, Graduate School of Business at Columbia University, New York, N.Y. He also served in leadership positions at Adelphi University, Garden City, N.Y. and New York University, New York, N.Y. He spent nearly 20 years prior to teaching economics at Amherst College, Amherst, Ma., Hamilton College, Clinton, N.Y. and Centre College of Kentucky, Danville, KY. He also served as a consultant in economics and higher education to Bechtel Corporation, Borg-Warner and the Academy for Education Development, Inc.

Dr. Brown has authored many publications. He received his A.B. in economics from Union College, and his M.S. and Ph.D. in labor economics and economic theory from the University of Wisconsin.



A PIONEER'S 20TH ANNIVERSARY

Thomas Edison State College began in 1971 as an idea: like Thomas Edison himself, many adults acquire college-level knowledge on their own. Through examinations and portfolio assessment, that knowledge could be measured and college credits awarded for it.

The New York State Board of Regents had just started an external degree program, and Chancellor of Higher Education Ralph Dungan wanted to be sure New Jersey did more than watch from the sidelines. On December 17, 1971, he won approval from the State Board of Higher Education for the establishment of Thomas Edison College, effective July 1, 1972.

To implement the new idea, the chancellor appointed a 24-member advisory council in March 1972, enlisting representatives of public and private colleges, labor, business, governmental agencies and the New York Regents program.

At the first meeting, the council agreed that New Jersey's program would differ from New York's in one important respect: while New York limited student contact to the registrar's office, counseling of students was seen as an essential ingredient of the Thomas Edison program. An interstate agreement was drawn up, establishing the New York-New Jersey College Proficiency Examination Program and making Thomas Edison a degree-granting institution in cooperation with the New York State Regents External Degree Program.

The College was granted the right to award the Associate in Arts degree in July 1972. At the same time, the institution took over its first home — rented office space at 1750 North Olden Ave. in Ewing Township. Dr. James Douglas Brown, Jr., was named College president that summer and Thomas Edison enrolled its first students in November.

By the spring of 1973, the College was in full swing. During the month of June, the State Board of Education approved Thomas Edison State College as the ninth state college, with an independent board of trustees; 70 students were awarded the College's first A.A. degrees; and the Middle States Association of Colleges and School, accepted Thomas Edison as a candidate for accreditation.

In September, the new board of trustees voted to end the joint agreement with the New York Regents. Just 14 months after being chartered as a New Jersey state college, Thomas Edison was striking out on its own.

That rapid progression from idea to institution illustrates two traits that have characterized Thomas Edison from the beginning — pioneering spirit matched by a determination to get things done. Less than five years after its establishment, the College received full accreditation from the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools in April 1976.

What may be the best example of the College's innovative approach is Thomas Edison's move into downtown Trenton in September 1979, at a time when other institutions were leaving cities.

The seven-year-old college, which had spent three years at the Forrestal Center outside of Princeton, needed room for growth. At the same time, the state was looking for an appropriate tenant for the landmark Kelsey Building at the edge of the Capital Complex, while the city sought to preserve the building's historic use as a school.

Concern that the College would outgrow the Kelsey Building at first deterred President Brown from agreeing to the plan. But State Senate President Joseph P. Merlino found the solution when he persuaded Gov. Brendan T. Byrne that the brick townhouses between the Kelsey Building and the State House were ideal for College expansion. At a time when developers were threatening the residential character of the State House Historic District, that planned marriage of the block's architectural gem and its less showy neighbors satisfied College, state and city concerns.

The building is a fitting home for this College. It was designed for the School of Industrial Arts, an institution that offered Trenton's working men and women the chance to increase their knowledge and skill in their off-hours. While many Thomas Edison students fit that description, the College's enrollment represents a cross-section of the American workforce of the 1990s. Their average age is 39, with 97.5 percent over the age of 24. Many seek college degrees to increase their job skills, while others enroll after retirement, when reentering the job force after raising a family or simply for personal satisfaction.

Thomas Edison has awarded over 9,000 degrees. The College has 8,600 currently enrolled students who reside in 49 states and 65 other nations. Six out of 10 students are men; two-thirds live in New Jersey.

Twenty years after it was founded, Thomas Edison State College is one of New Jersey's 12 senior public colleges and universities, offering 119 areas of study leading to 11 baccalaureate and associate degrees.

The depth of the College's accomplishment in a short period is a tribute to its staff and the leadership of three presidents. Dr. Larraine R. Matusak succeeded President Brown in July of 1978. Four years later, Dr. George A. Pruitt was appointed president.

While strengthening its programs, the College also has strengthened its commitment to leadership in both public service and higher education. An undertaking of Thomas Edison and the city of Trenton, the Trenton Office of Policy Studies (TOPS) works to analyze emerging public policy issues which affect the city; educate decision-makers about the issues; and participate in the formulation of recommendations and plans for addressing these issues.

Through programs like the Statewide Counseling Network, the Thomas Edison College Examination Program and the Individual Assessment Program (all established in 1974), the Statewide Testing and Assessment Center (1981), the Computer Assisted Lifelong Learning (CALL) Network (1991), the Center for Corporate and Public Partnerships (1983), and the Institute on the Assessment of Experiential Learning (1989), Thomas Edison has made and kept its reputation as a pioneer in adult education.

The College's mission statement mandates innovation and exploration of innovative educational methods, within a framework of adherence to high academic standards.

Twenty years after its creation, Thomas Edison State College can look back on its history and at the students who have benefited from it, with pride in accomplishments and a renewed commitment to remain an innovator.
