




The Thomas Edison State College Foundation has been awarded a grant of \$50,000 from the Verizon (formerly Bell Atlantic) Foundation to develop the College's new Certificate in Distance Education Program, which provides faculty with professional training in developing courses and in teaching courses on the World Wide Web.



This program stimulates faculty imagination, empowering them to communicate, teach and facilitate student learning in new ways.

"For faculty, a key factor in successfully teaching in a distance learning environment is learning how to avoid or overcome the barriers that sometimes occur in a networked learning community," explained William Seaton, associate vice president for Distance
Education, Center for Distance
& Independent Adult Learning
(DIAL) at Thomas Edison State
College. "For example, how
does one make a course delivered online personal and interactive? This program will
address these concerns, and
deal with issues like timely feedback to and from students and
with the technical difficulties
that some students will have."

Competing in a Global Economy? New e-Commerce Certificate Program Can Help

The Internet has made it possible for businesses large and small to compete in the global marketplace. To assist those faced with this competition, Thomas Edison State College has developed an online e-Commerce certificate program that provides students the skills needed to compete in a global economy.

The 12-credit, e-Commerce certificate program, created specifically for Thomas Edison State College, is being offered online during the College's Summer 1 semester beginning in May 2001.

The certificate program includes three newly developed, 3-credit courses: Creating and Implementing the Electronic Enterprise, Product and Services Development for Electronic

Enterprise and Marketing with
Electronic Media. These
courses were created by
College faculty mentor
Nora Carrol, president
of FirstForward.com,
an interactive learning and communications company.
Students will also

need to complete

either Principles of Management or Introduction to Marketing online as part of the e-Commerce certificate requirements.

"Commerce on the Internet is growing beyond all expectation as enterprises expand their operations in all spheres," said Dr. Henry van Zyl, director of the College's Distance Education Programs. "Thomas Edison State College recognizes the need for thorough preparation and grounding for entrepreneurs who venture into this arena. The online certificate in e-Commerce, which includes a choice of two existing courses and three new courses designed and created specifically for the purpose of preparing entrepreneurs for this environment, is a timely offering. It should prove very valuable—especially among entrepreneurs seeking to establish their credentials in this field."

Meet One of Our Best...

Dr. Sharon L. Bender '96, '97

When Dr. Sharon L. Bender began to pursue her goal of earning a college degree at Thomas Edison State College, she did not realize that her experience would eventually culminate in a doctoral degree. Nor did she realize that she would accomplish several awards for academic achievement, a career as a distance education professor and the authorship of a college textbook.

Reminiscing about that time eight years ago when she first decided to pursue an associate degree, Dr. Bender said, "I felt left out not having a college degree. So when I found a small article in a local New Jersey newspaper that talked about earning a degree at a distance from Thomas Edison State College, it certainly caught my eye. I remember thinking that living in New Jersey was convenient just in case I had to travel to the campus, and I could learn from home meaning there would be no interruption in my work life. This was the first time I had even heard about distance education."

She enrolled in the College's Associate in Science in Management program and was awarded the degree in 1996. Dr. Bender recalls, "When I completed the program and was awarded the degree, I enjoyed the greatest sense of accomplishment imaginable. But I couldn't stop there. I was

hooked."

So the next step was to enroll in Thomas Edison State College's Bachelor of Arts program which she completed in 1997. Not only did she earn a baccalaureate degree, but she was also listed in the publication, Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges and was named a recipient of the College's Arnold Fletcher Award for exceptional achievement in independent learning.

The completion of her bachelor's degree was still not the end of her educational journey. "My college experience was so addictive," she said, "that I went on to earn the Master of Science in Information Management-Technologies Focus from ISIM University (International School of Information Management) in Denver, Colorado, also at a distance." After earning the MSIM degree in 1998, she enrolled in Capella University's distance doctoral program in Organization and Management and was awarded a Ph.D. in December 2000. "I had an eightyear contiguous distance education experience that is likely unparalleled," Dr. Bender said.

"As a result of these melded experiences I was subsequently hired as a faculty member at both ISIM University and Capella University where I design and teach courses in bachelor's and master's degree programs. One of the courses I've designed will



be featured on the Internet among the best-designed distance education courses worldwide through a program called *Basket of Winners.*"

She continued, "As a distance education instructor, I have the chance to help others achieve their dream. And because I want my students to come away with a little more than they expected, I've developed a Web site to assist them in successfully completing the numerous courses I teach."

Dr. Bender was recently asked to design a course for Capella University concerning the organizational impact to technology adoption, but she could not find an existing textbook that would work for the course. The only acceptable solution was to write the textbook herself. Dr. Bender enthusiastically noted that upon submitting a proposal, it is already being considered for publication.

When asked what she would say to someone who was "leery" of learning at a distance, Dr. Bender said she informs aspiring distance learners about the history of distance education and discusses how it is now in its fifth generation. "I also mention that some famous individuals have earned their degree through distance learning," she said, citing that Franklin D. Roosevelt, Walter Cronkite and Barry Goldwater are among these learners.

To assist these aspiring distance learners, Dr. Bender has produced a guidebook, Preparing for Distance Education, which is nearing readiness for publication. The book features what other distance learners are saying about their experiences, such as the fact that it makes it possible to spend more quality time on their studies rather than have to travel to the classroom. Dr. Bender noted that others report that they have been able to escalate the degree earning process for much the same reason.

In the guidebook, Dr.
Bender further notes, "It is a simple matter to produce a paper or homework assignment at your desktop computer and send it through e-mail directly to your respective instructor for immediate assessment. No longer is distance education referred to merely as education that takes place where there is geographic distance between learner and instructor. It has evolved to a higher level of sophistication."

Dr. Sharon (as her students affectionately refer to her), resides in Newton, N.J. with her husband of 29 years and her two grown children. In her spare time she likes to write about the work environment, women's issues, the Internet and distance education. Her

first in a series of articles on the American Women Entrepreneur will be featured in an upcoming issue of the magazine *Garden State Women*. The remaining series will appear on the magazine's Web site.

"I feel as though I'm just getting started in the career I've only dreamed about until that small article in a local New Jersey newspaper about Thomas Edison State College caught my eye," Dr. Bender said. She concluded, "In sum, I studied in the convenience of my home and now I work from the convenience of my home doing something I absolutely love to do, thanks to Thomas Edison State College. I would never have had the credibility or courage to pursue my dreams otherwise."

The project, called Children's Futures, provides for an intensive effort to explore opportunities, leadership, ideas and financing committed to improving children's health outcomes in Trenton.



Thomas Edison State College Signs Partnership Agreement with University of South Africa

In a groundbreaking agreement with one of the world's leading distance learning universities, Thomas Edison State College has entered into a far reaching partnership with the University of South Africa (UNISA). UNISA is the oldest and largest university in South Africa, one of the most well respected purveyors of distance education in the world, and it counts Nelson Mandela among its distinguished alumni. The agreement will provide the College with access to an outstanding collection of distance education courses and opportunities to develop new joint degree programs, giving Thomas Edison State College students more high quality educational options than ever before.

The partnership also provides UNISA with access to Thomas Edison State College's expertise in such areas as prior learning assessment (the documentation of college-level learning a student may have gained outside of a traditional classroom) and with a new perspective on North American higher education, in general, and distance education, in particular.

Perhaps the most

significant aspect of this partnership is that it links two institutions that have common missions, despite their being some 9,000 miles apart and on different continents. Both Thomas Edison State College and the University of South Africa are dedicated to providing flexible high quality educational opportunities to adults, and this partnership will support that shared mission in a most meaningful way.

The recently signed agreement was the culmination of months of discussions between the two institutions of higher learning. Under the terms of the agreement. Thomas Edison State College gains access to the more than 2,000 high quality distance education courses developed by UNISA's internationally recognized faculty. Thomas Edison State College will adapt and revise selected UNISA courses and offer them to its students in the United States and around the world. In addition, the two institutions will initiate the development of joint degree programs, beginning with a Bachelor of Arts degree in American and African Studies. Under the agreement, Thomas Edison State College staff will also provide UNISA with expert advice and training in the areas of prior learning assessment and the evaluation of corporate training for college credit

At a ceremony held in

Pretoria, South Africa, a

Memorandum of Agreement was officially signed by Thomas Edison State College's president, Dr. George A. Pruitt, and UNISA's principal and vice chancellor, Prof. Antony Melck The signing of the agreement was witnessed by delegations from Thomas Edison State College and UNISA. In addition to Dr. Pruitt, the Thomas Edison State College delegation included Carole Nerlino-Cerepak, Chairperson of the College's Board of Trustees; Esther Paist, **Executive Assistant to** the President and Director of Institutional Planning at the College: and Dr Henry van Zyl, Director of Distance Learning Programs in the College's Center for Distance & Independent Adult Learning (DIAL).

In remarks made at the ceremony, Dr. Pruitt said, "By entering into this agreement with the University of South Africa, Thomas Edison State College sets the seal on its first international partnership. I can think of no finer institution to be affiliated with in this capacity than UNISA."

The agreement allows for the two institutions to share faculty consultants and gain access to new perspectives on distance education in an international context. Both institutions will benefit mutually from the exchange of ideas, materials and staff. Thomas Edison State College and UNISA will also explore other areas of partnership as needs arise and interest is expressed.

UNISA is the largest university in South Africa and one of the largest distance education institutions in the world. It was established in 1873 as the University of the

Cape of Good Hope and chartered in 1877. In 1916 its name was changed to the University of South Africa. In 1946, it pioneered tertiary distance education in the western world and has

been a leader in this field ever since. UNISA's many distinguished alumni include Nelson Mandela, former president of South Africa. In fact, Mandela studied at a distance with UNISA while he was incarcerated on Robben Island.

mega-distance education universities in the world (universities with more than 100,000 students), and its qualifications are recognized worldwide. It has approximately 112,000 registered students and 4,000 faculty and staff. UNISA offers certificate, diploma and degree programs up to the doctoral level in six "faculties" or schools: Arts, Economic and Management Sciences, Law, Science, Education, and Theology and Religious Studies.

UNISA is one of 11

In further comments made after his return from Pretoria, Dr. Pruitt said, "It is wonderful to know that because of this agreement, Thomas Edison State College students will now have

access to some of the finest course materials available in the world. These new courses. along with Thomas Edison State College's existing distance education courses and other credit-earning opportunities, will provide our adult students with an unparalleled level of high quality educational options. I am also pleased that UNISA will be able to benefit from the expertise of Thomas Edison State College staff, as they provide training to UNISA staff on the assessment of prior learning. This is a true partnership in every sense of the word."



The John S. Watson Institute for Public Policy was chosen to lead the study because of the Institute's effectiveness as a non-partisan organization committed to conducting research that will inform the public policy decision-making process. Thomas Edison State College, the only higher education institution based in Trenton, provides administrative, technical and other support for the project through the Watson Institute.

The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation is the nation's largest philanthropy devoted exclusively to health and health care. It concentrates its grantmaking in three goal areas: to assure that all Americans have access to basic health care at a reasonable cost; to improve care and support for people with chronic health conditions; and to reduce the personal, social and economic harm caused by substance abuse including tobacco, alcohol and illicit drugs.

The Children's Futures project team is currently analyzing the major threats to children's health in Trenton, reviewing research findings about effective programs, developing a profile of local institutions and programs working to improve children's health, identifying gaps in local services and programs, and exploring ideas to improve health outcomes for children.

Directing Children's Futures for the Watson Institute is Rush L. Russell. He said, "Despite the best efforts of many organizations and individuals, many critical health outcomes for children fail to improve. Although some progress has been made recently, the United States—the wealthiest nation on Earth—ranks at the bottom of most industrialized nations in terms of the health of our children."

He added, "But the real disparity lies, not just between the U.S. and other countries, but between how our children are faring in communities like Trenton, and those living in more affluent communities. This study is designed to help us better understand why these gaps exist, and what could be done to narrow them for children in Trenton."

Dr. George A. Pruitt,
President of Thomas Edison
State College, expressed the
College's support for the project. "The Children's Futures
project holds great promise in
identifying practical ideas for
improving the health of children
throughout Trenton. We are
proud that The Robert Wood
Johnson Foundation has selected Thomas Edison State College
as its partner to undertake this
groundbreaking work."

It is the hope of the Watson Institute and Thomas Edison State College that the results of this very important project will not only have a positive impact on the health status of Trenton's youth, but will also result in a far-reaching positive outcome for children all around the country.
